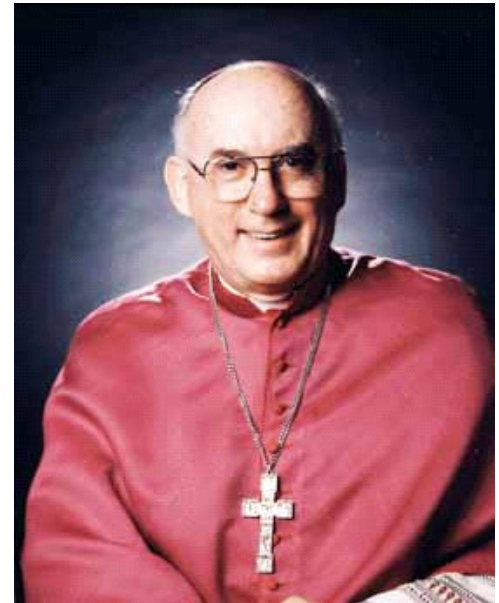

WEEK TWO

Jesus in the Scriptures

Jesus said to them: “A man had two sons. The younger of them said to his father, ‘Father, give me the share of the estate that is coming to me.’ So the father divided up the property. Some days later this younger son collected all his belongings and went off to a distant land, where he squandered his money on dissolute living. After he had spent everything, a great famine broke out in that country and he was in dire need...Coming to his senses at last, he said: ‘How many hired hands at my father’s place have more than enough to eat, while here I am starving! I will break away and return to my father, and say to him, ‘Father, I have sinned against God and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son. Treat me like one of your hired hands. ...While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him and was deeply moved. He ran out to meet him, threw his arms around his neck, and kissed him.’” Luke 15:11-20

Jesus in the World

Dorothy Day’s life-changing conversion was a rather unexpected one. After all, Day had been brought up in a wholly non-religious setting. In this decidedly secular setting, her social consciousness was awakened and channeled first into the Socialist movement. Day became an anarchist, joining in demonstrations and being arrested six times. Sitting in the cell gave her time to reflect on Jesus Christ. She realized how ego was central to many of her efforts, and how Jesus needed to be central to everything. After her release from prison, she began to attend Mass regularly and helped form a community (which spawned the Catholic Worker movement) that lived out the gospel’s radical message by providing food, shelter and hospitality for the poor as well as struggling for social change. Christian love was for Dorothy Day a matter of accepting the gifts that God gave her, and then sharing it with the rest of the Body of Christ.

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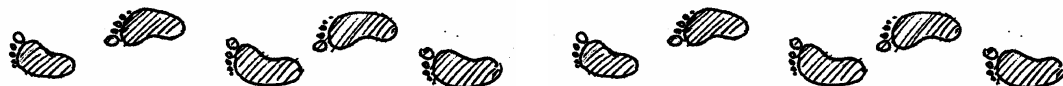

WEEK FOUR

Jesus in the Scriptures

Jesus said to them: “Do you not understand this parable? Then how are you going to understand any of the parables? The sower sows the word. These are the ones on the path where the word is sown. As soon as they hear, Satan comes at once and takes away the word sown in them. And these are the ones sown on the rocky ground who, when they hear the word, receive it at once with joy. But they have no root; they last only for a time. Then when tribulation or persecution comes because of the word, they quickly fall away. Those sown among thorns are another sort. They are the people who hear the word but worldly anxiety, the lure of riches, and the craving for things intrude and choke the word, and it bears no fruit. But those sown on rich soil are the ones who hear the word and accept it and bear fruit thirty and sixty and a hundredfold.”

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Jesus in the World

Monica (d. 387, AD) and Augustine (d. 430, AD) stand as a mother/son relationship in which Monica, as mother, deeply desired that the gift of faith in her son Augustine would come alive. To that end she poured forth many tears and prayers for his conversion. On her death bed, she witnessed: “I did have one reason for wanting to live a little longer: to see you become a Catholic Christian before I died. God has lavished his gifts on me in that respect, for I know that you even renounced earthly happiness to be his servant.”

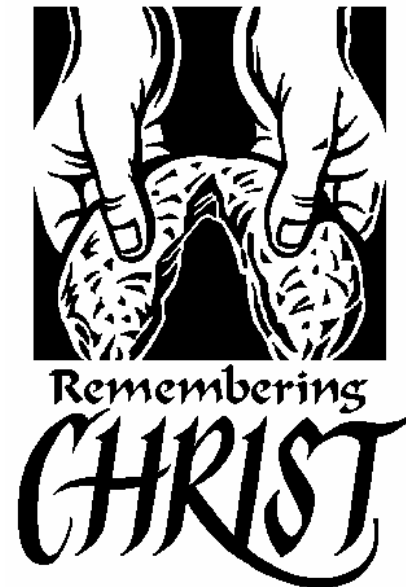
